COURSE DESCRIPTION

AP Art History: Explore the history of art across the globe from prehistory to the present. You'll analyze works of art through observation, discussion, reading, and research.

AP 2D: is an introductory college-level two-dimensional design course. Students refine and apply 2-D skills to ideas they develop throughout the course.

AP 3D: is an introductory college-level three-dimensional design course. Students refine and apply 3-D skills to ideas they develop throughout the course.

AP Drawing: introductory college-level drawing course. Students refine and apply drawing skills to ideas they develop throughout the course.
